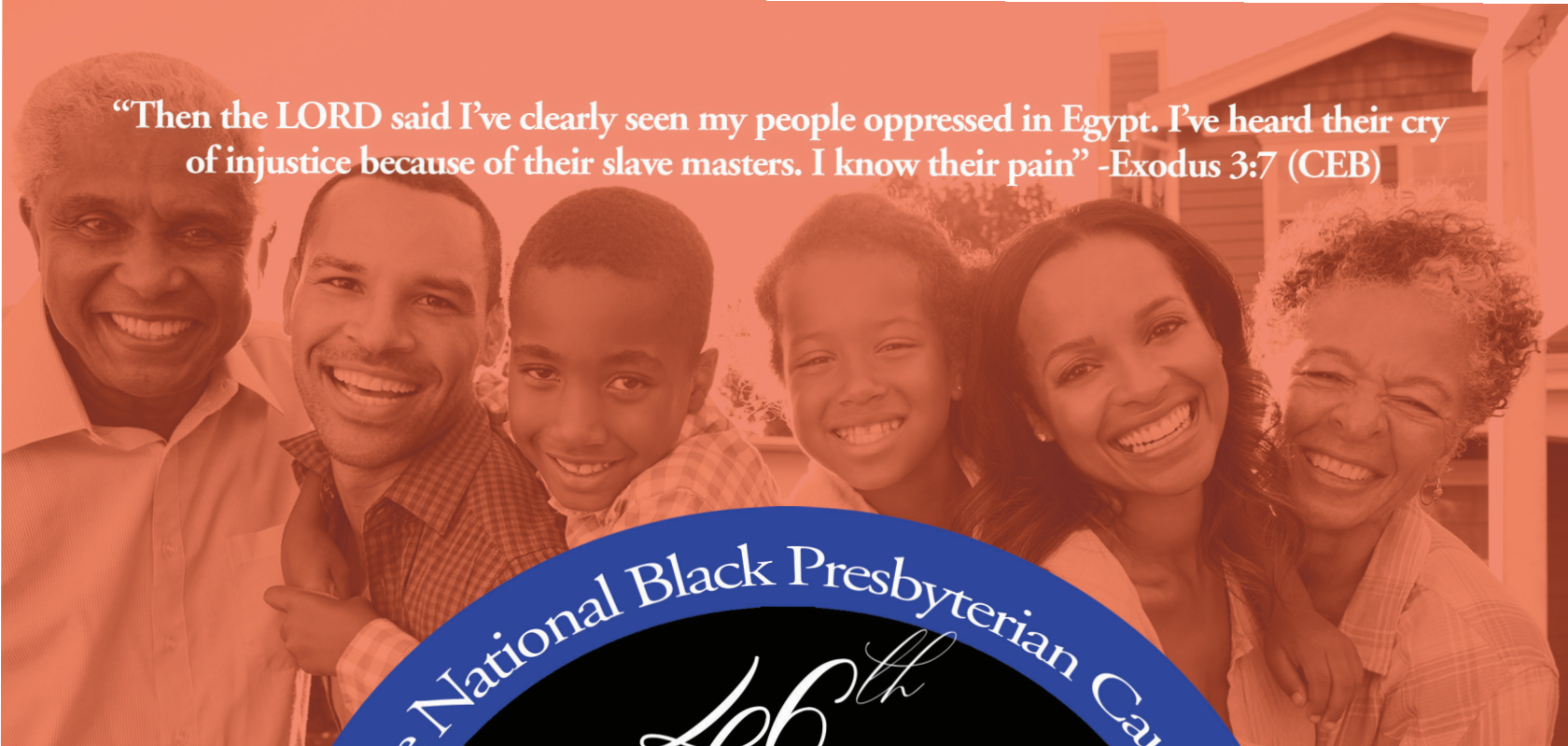

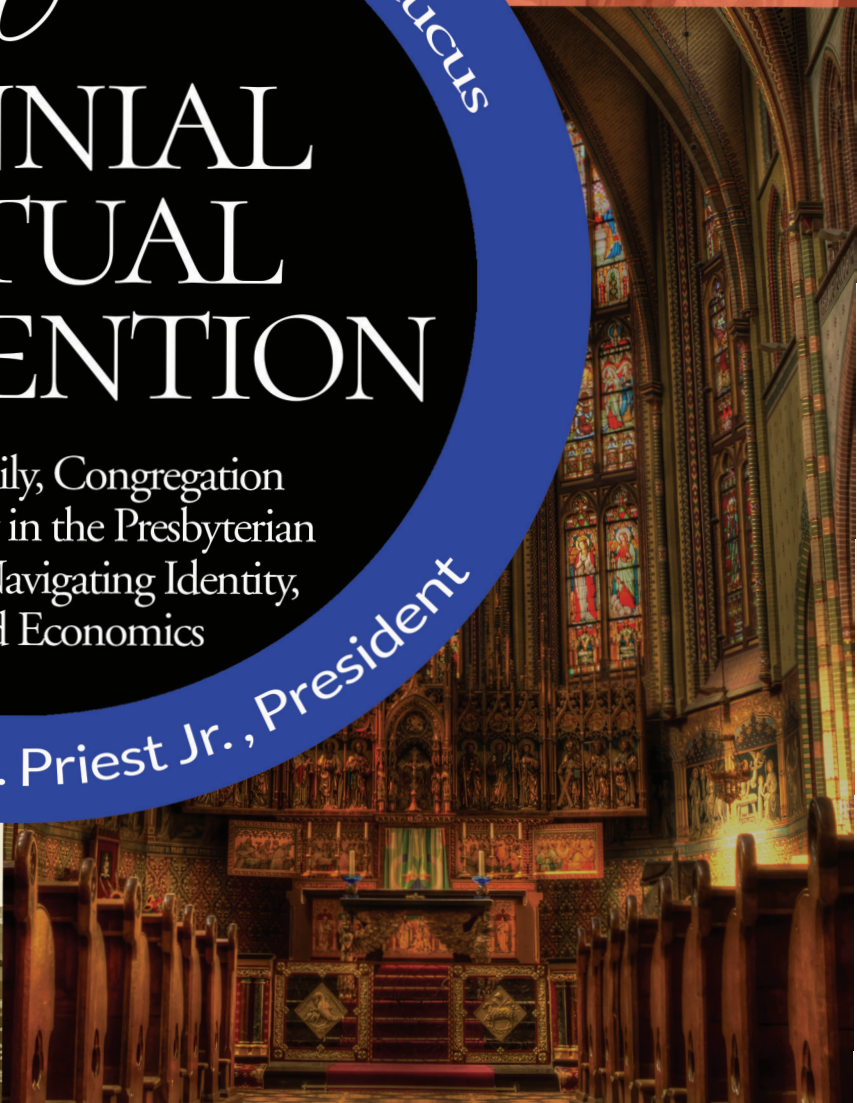
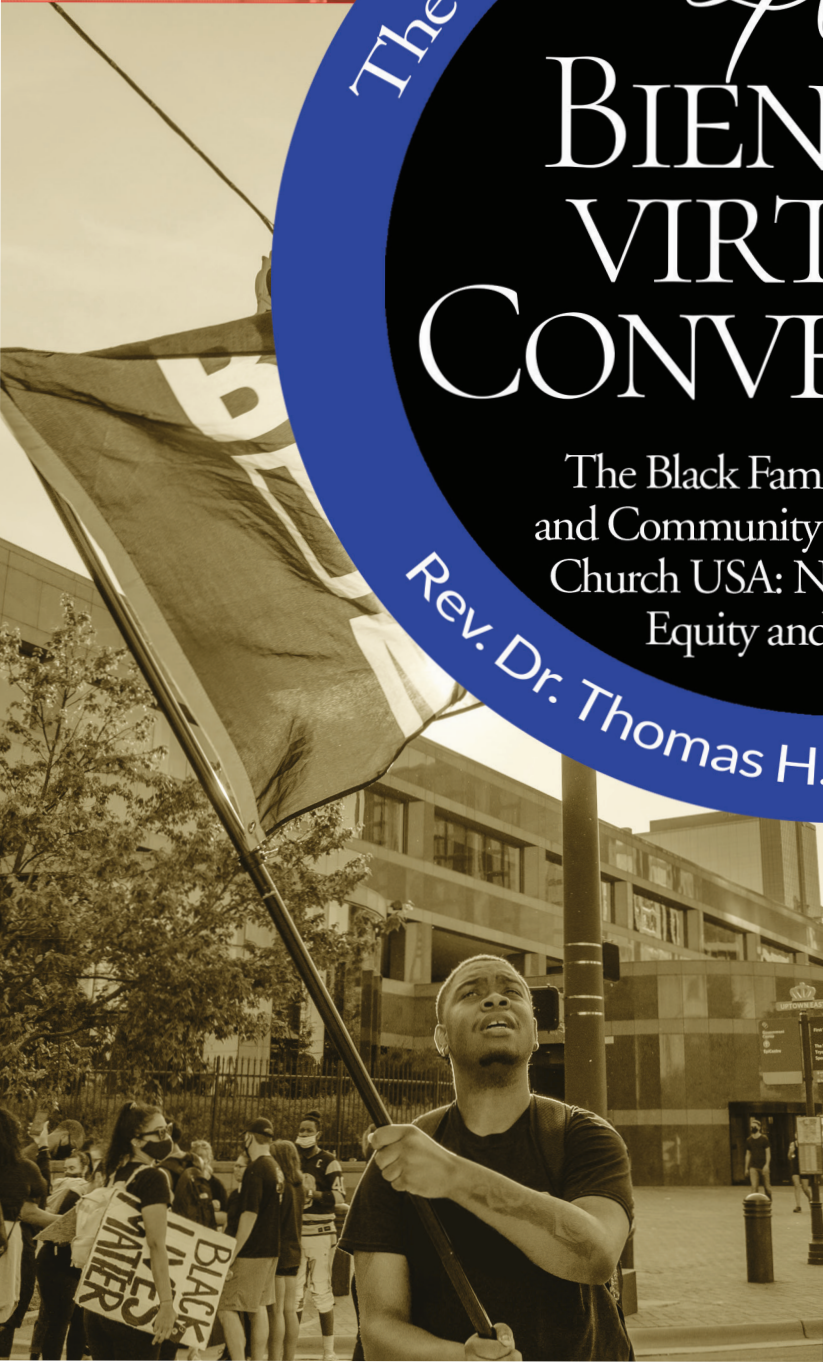

She is known throughout the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery and surrounding communities for her involvement as a musician in the PC(USA) and has served several predominantly African American Presbyterian congregations since 1992, as substitute, interim, and permanent musician: St. Paul Presbyterian, Hollywood, SC; Wallingford Presbyterian, Charleston, SC; St. Luke Presbyterian, Orangeburg, SC; Zion Olivet Presbyterian, North Charleston, SC; as well as many other collaborations within and outside of the Presbytery. Though a staunch Presbyterian, Simplicia has also served in the same capacity with other predominantly African American congregations outside of the denomination: First African Evangelical Christian Church and Memorial Baptist Church, both in Charleston, SC.

An imperfect servant after God's own heart, Simplicia has served for the past 8 years as the Church Administrator for Dorchester Presbyterian Church in Summerville, SC. She is also the founder of Simply Piano Music Studio(2016), LLC, where the essential art and foundation of sight reading music and vocal training is taught and nurtured. Her educational background includes an Associate in Art Education and Human Services from Trident College and a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education from South Carolina State University. Simplicia is married to Stewart Smith, Executive Board Trustee for I.L.A. Local 1422-A, and they have five children and one granddaughter. She is also a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.
